

- (b) the Village Health Commission shall, in each year and until final repayment of the sum borrowed, insert in the annual estimates as a charge on its revenues the annual instalment payable in the year to which such estimates relate ;
- (c) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Village Health Commission for the construction of a bridge.

2. For the purposes of securing the repayment of the sum due under the loan the Village Health Commission is hereby authorized, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, to mortgage to the Lender all the fees, charges and rates now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Village Health Commission under the provisions of the Public Health (Villages) Law.

THE PENSIONS LAW.

CAP. 288 AND LAWS 4 OF 1952 AND 1 OF 1955.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2863

MADE UNDER SECTION 2 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 (1) of the Pensions Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration and Consolidation) (Amendment) Order, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Pensionable Offices (Declaration and Consolidation) Orders, 1953 to 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration and Consolidation) Orders, 1953 to 1956.

2. In addition to the offices declared to be pensionable offices under the principal Order, the offices set out in the Schedule hereto are declared pensionable offices for the purposes of the Pensions Law.
