THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL,
1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Modification of "Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953") Regulations, 1956.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Commissioner may by Order provide that any board established under the provisions of section 6 thereof shall be deemed to be lawfully constituted and shall continue to function and have all the powers and exercise all the duties of such a board through its appointed members under section 7 or any number of them as may be determined by the Commissioner:—

- (a) irrespective of the absence or resignation of any of its elected members; or
 - (b) notwithstanding the fact that elections under sections 11 to 14 (both inclusive) have not been held, or are or have been waived as provided in regulation 3 hereof.
3. (a) The Commissioner of each District may in respect of any board within his district and at his absolute discretion waive the holding of the elections as in sections 11 to 14 of the Law provided by notice under his hand and thereafter the board shall function through its members appointed under section 7.
- (b) Any elections which became due to be held before the coming into operation of these Regulations and which have not been held shall be deemed, for the purposes of paragraph (a), to have been duly waived by the Commissioner, and the appointed members thereof shall continue in office.
