

And whereas the Governor has approved the plans submitted and considers it expedient, having regard to all the circumstances, that the Water Commission of Sykhari should be permitted to acquire the immovable property :

THE ANTIQUITIES LAW.

CAP. 43.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 35 (d).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 35 (d) of the Antiquities Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Antiquities (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Antiquities Regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 12 is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "ten shillings" occurring therein and the substitution therefor of the words "five hundred mils".

3. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 17 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following :—

"(1) In this part of these Regulations—
'resident' means—

- (i) any person who ordinarily resides in the Colony ;
- (ii) any officer or other rank of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces ; and
- (iii) any officer or other rank of an Allied Naval, Military or Air Force stationed in the Colony."

4. Regulation 18 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "five shillings" from the first proviso thereto and the substitution therefor of the words "five hundred mils".
