

No. 1269. THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW.
CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952, 43 OF 1955 AND 22 OF 1956.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 7.

Whereas by Notification published under No. 722 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 24th November, 1955, the Governor declared the establishment and operation of a Police Training Camp to be an undertaking of public utility ;

And whereas the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia by a notice published under Notification No. 979 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 12th October, 1956, gave particulars of the land required in connection with the aforesaid undertaking of public utility (hereinafter referred to as " the land ") ;

And whereas the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia forwarded to the Governor the required recommendations, plan and particulars no objection to the proposed requisition having been made ;

And whereas, the Governor has approved the plan and particulars submitted, and has considered it expedient, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, that the land be acquired :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the Land Acquisition Law, the Governor does hereby sanction the acquisition under the provisions of the said Law, of the land.

**No. 1270. THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL
(ALIEN REGULATION) LAW.**

CAP. 124.

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Law :

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted ; and, they have undertaken that, if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names,
