CAP. 233 AND LAWS 26 OF 1952 AND 22 OF 1956.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to the Notification No. 154 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 1st March, 1956, notice is hereby given that the following lands are required for the undertaking of public utility mentioned therein :—

All that area of privately owned lands, with everything standing thereon, comprising 20 donums, 1 evlek and 2,000 sq. ft. or thereabouts, forming part of plot No. 83 and the whole of plots Nos. 76 and 77 of Block M, Larnaca Town, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan signed by the Director of Public Works and dated 10th November, 1956.

2. Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said lands who objects to the acquisition is required within ten days from the date of the publication of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and of the evidence thereof, and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.

3. The Government is willing to treat for the acquisition of the said lands.

4. A plan showing the lands described above is available for inspection at my office.

5. The period mentioned in paragraph 2 hereof has been abridged to ten days with the approval of His Excellency the Governor.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 17) 1956.**

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 44.

Whereas by Order dated the 9th October, 1956, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 18th October, 1956, under Notification No. 988 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor had authorized the use as accommodation for members of the Prisons Staff of the premises set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Orta Keuy village, Nicosia (hereinafter referred to as "the premises"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of three months;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the premises should continue to be used as accommodation for members of the Prisons Staff for a further period of two months as from the expiration of the Order:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Emergency Regulation 44, as set out in the First Schedule to the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 17) 1956 (which continues in force by virtue of the Emergency Powers (Continuance) Order, 1955), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorization for using the premises as accommodation for members of the Prisons Staff, subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of two months as from the 9th January, 1957, and the Order is so extended accordingly.
