THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 2nd February, 1956, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 9th February, 1956, under Notification No. 90 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Boghaz (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 797 and 73 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 23rd August, 1956 and 31st January, 1957, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 1st August, 1957;
