

No. 868. THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS) REGULATIONS, 1956.

NOTICE (No. 16) UNDER CLAUSE 3 OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

The import into the Colony by any importer registered under the provisions of the Defence (Registration of Importers) Order, 1956, of the goods shown in the List hereunder from Japan is hereby permitted without a written licence under regulation 3 (1) (a) of the above-named Regulations, subject to the following terms and conditions :—

- (a) that payment for such goods shall be made in sterling to a Transferable Account ;
- (b) that such goods shall originate in and imported from Japan ;
- (c) that shipment of such goods will be made not later than the 15th March, 1958, and the goods shall be cleared from Customs on or before the 15th June, 1958.

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2. Notice (No. 12) which was published in *Gazette Supplement No. 3* of the 9th May, 1957, under Notification No. 517, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
