**THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.**

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 23rd October, 1955, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 24th October, 1955, under Notification No. 652 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated in the village of Eylenja (hereinafter referred to as "the land") subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 291, 1164 and 396 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 12th April, 1956, 29th November, 1956 and 11th April, 1957 respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 22nd October, 1957;

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the land should continue to be used for military purposes for a further period of six months:
