Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Defence Regulation 64, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1956), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to order and hereby orders that the aforesaid authorisation for using the land for military purposes subject to the restrictions and conditions laid down in the Order be continued for a further period of six months as from the 29th November, 1957, and the Order is so extended accordingly.

**THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.**

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 64.

Whereas by Order dated the 10th November, 1955, and published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 12th November, 1955, under Notification No. 714 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Excellency the Governor has authorised the use for military purposes of the land and property set out in the Second Schedule to the Order, situated at Katholiki Quarter, Limassol (hereinafter referred to as "the land"), subject to the restrictions and conditions therein laid down for a period of six months ;

And whereas by virtue of Notifications Nos. 334, 1164 and 496 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazettes* of the 26th April, 1956, 29th November, 1956 and 2nd May, 1957, respectively, the Order was extended for further periods of six months up to the 9th November, 1957 ;
