BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Limassol hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Limassol Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1957, and shall be read as one with the Limassol Municipal Bye-laws, 1953 to 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal bye-laws"), and the principal bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Limassol Municipal Bye-laws, 1953 to 1957.

2. The principal bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 46 of the following bye-law:—

"46A.—(1) The Council may from time to time by public notification fix places for the purpose of holding at least once a week Open Air Markets for perishable goods.

(2) The Open Air Markets for perishable goods shall be under the management and control of an Inspector appointed by the Council:

Provided that—

(a) each such Inspector shall comply with the instructions he may receive from time to time from the Mayor; and

(b) the same person may be appointed as an Inspector of more than one market whether open air or not.

(3) The place or places at which and the manner in which perishable goods shall be exposed for sale within the Open Air Markets shall be appointed and regulated by the Inspector in accordance with the instructions he may from time to time receive from the Mayor.

(4) The tolls prescribed by bye-law 41 shall be paid by the owner or the person in charge of perishable goods brought into or on sale in the Open Air Markets for perishable goods.

(5) The Inspector, or any other person authorised in writing by the Mayor, may at any time enter any places believed by him to contain perishable goods in contravention of that bye-law."

3. Bye-law 53 of the principal bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"53. In this chapter of these bye-laws—

The term 'fresh meat' means the meat, whether fresh or frozen or otherwise preserved but not including meat preserved in tins or other receptacles, of any bullock, cow, ox, calf, goat, kid, sheep, lamb or poultry."

4. The principal bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 57 of the following bye-law:—

"57A. In this chapter of these bye-laws—

The term 'fresh pork' means pork, whether fresh or frozen, or otherwise preserved but not including pork preserved in tins or other receptacles."

5. The principal bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 62 of the following bye-law:—

"62A. In this chapter of these bye-laws—

The term 'fresh fish' means fish, whether fresh or frozen, or otherwise preserved but not including fish preserved in tins or other receptacles."
