

6. The principal bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 70 of the following bye-law :—

“70A. The provisions of Part III of these bye-laws shall not apply to any person selling fresh meat, pork, poultry, fish or perishable goods outside a Meat, Pork or Fish Market or a Market of Perishable Goods in premises specially approved by the Council: provided however that the provisions of bye-laws 68 and 70 shall apply to such person as if such premises were a municipal market.”

7. The principal bye-laws are hereby amended by the addition at the end of paragraph (2) of bye-law 210 of the following proviso, the full stop at the end of the said paragraph (2) being substituted by a colon :

“Provided that after 15 years' continuous service or employment of a temporary officer or regular servant or labourer, a gratuity under bye-law 209 to such officer or servant or labourer shall, with the Council's approval, be at the rate of a month's pay or four weeks' pay, as the case may be, for each complete year of service or employment as detailed in this paragraph.”

8. The First Schedule to the principal bye-laws (as set out in the Limassol Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1955), is hereby amended by the deletion of item 58 thereof and the substitution therefor of the following item :—

“58. Oranges (Jaffa type) 100 . . 5 mils for every 100 pieces.”

No. 1076. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW.
CAP. 142.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF YIALIA UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Law, the Village Health Commission of Yialia hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Yialia) Rules, 1957, and shall come into operation on their publication in the *Gazette*.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this rule, the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952, published in the *Gazette* of the 19th November, 1952, shall—

(a) be deemed to be rules made by the Village Health Commission of Yialia and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the village of Yialia.

(2) The rules set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding rules of the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952.

(3) Those rules of the Village Health (Nikos) Rules, 1952, mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto shall not apply to the village of Yialia.

PART I.

RULES TO BE SUBSTITUTED.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires, the following terms have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say :—

“animal”, save when in any part or chapter of these rules otherwise defined, means an ass, camel, cow, goat, horse, kid, lamb, mule, ox, sheep or swine ;
