THE POST OFFICE LAW.
CAP. 281 AND LAW 44 OF 1953.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2989

MADE UNDER SECTION 7.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the Post Office Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Air Parcel Post Rates) Order, 1957.

2. There shall be charged a combined Postage and Air fee at the rate set forth in the third column of the Schedule hereto in respect of air parcels posted in the Colony and intended for transmission by air mail to any of the countries of destination set forth in the first column of the said Schedule, through the route set forth in the second column thereof opposite each country.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1958, and thereupon the Post Office (Air Mail Rates of Postage) Orders, 1955 to 1957, shall be amended as follows :—

- (a) by the deletion from paragraph 2 thereof of the words "and a combined Postage and Air fee at the rate set forth in the seventh column of the said Schedule on air parcels," (lines 4 and 5) ;
- (b) by the deletion from the Schedule thereto of the seventh column.
