PROCLAMATION UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas by section 8 of the Assemblies, Meetings and Processions Law as amended by the Emergency Powers (Amendment of the Assemblies, Meetings and Processions Law) Regulations, 1958, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit generally the holding of any assembly (as defined in section 2 of the aforesaid Law) or may prohibit the holding of any assembly at any specified place or on any specified date or during any specified period, or within any specified hours :

And whereas by Proclamation dated the 26th November, 1955, the Governor did prohibit generally the holding of any assembly (other than theatrical or cinematograph performances) within the Colony until further notice :

And whereas I now deem it expedient to revoke the aforementioned Proclamation and make other provision in the manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said section 8 of the Assemblies, Meetings and Processions Law, as amended by the Emergency Powers (Amendment of the Assemblies, Meetings and Processions Law) Regulations, 1958, I, the Governor, do by this Proclamation prohibit generally the holding of any assembly within the Colony as from the 24th March, 1958, other than—

- (a) the holding of any theatrical or cinematograph performance ; and
- (b) any assembly or class of assembly held under the authority of a written permit issued by the Commissioner and in accordance with such terms and conditions, if any, as the Commissioner may deem fit to impose in such permit.

The Proclamation dated the 26th November, 1955, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of 26th November, 1955, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done, omitted or suffered thereunder.
