

No. 445. THE CONSULAR CONVENTIONS LAW, 1952.**ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 3022****MADE UNDER SECTION 8 (1).**

Whereas by section 8 (1) of the Consular Conventions Law, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the Law") it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order-in-Council, direct that section 2, 4, 6 or 7 of the Law shall apply to any foreign state specified in the Order, being a state with which a Consular Convention providing for matters for which provision is made by those sections has been concluded by Her Majesty;

And whereas a consular convention (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") between Her Majesty in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the President of the Federal Republic of Germany was signed at Bonn on the 30th day of July, 1956, which provides for matters for which provision is made in the said sections 2, 4, 6 and 7, and which enters into force on the thirtieth day after the date of exchange of instruments of ratification;

And whereas Her Majesty ratified the Convention which was entered into force on the 28th day of December, 1957:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 8 (1) of the Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Consular Conventions (Federal Republic of Germany) Order, 1958.

2. Sections 2, 4, 6 and 7 of the Law shall apply to the Federal Republic of Germany.

3. The Consular Conventions (Federal Republic of Germany) (Financial Privileges) Order, 1957, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
