THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 AND 1956.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 6 of the Emergency Powers Orders in Council, 1939 and 1956, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1958, and shall be read as one with the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 1) 1958 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 2) 1958.

4. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Regulation 75, of the following new Regulation :—

"Seizure and forfeiture of vessels and vehicles.

75A. Any police officer or any member of Her Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces may seize any vessel or vehicle suspected of being or of having been used for or in connection with the commission of an offence against these Regulations, or of any offence which is a specified offence for the purposes of the Special Court Laws, 1955 to 1957, or of any Law amending or substituted for the same, and the Special Court may, if satisfied that the vessel or vehicle was so used, either on application made by the police in that behalf or in the course of any proceedings against any person for the offence in connection with which such vessel or vehicle was used, order such vessel or vehicle to be forfeited."
