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**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (PUBLIC SAFETY AND ORDER)
REGULATIONS, 1955 TO (No. 2) 1958.**

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATION 34.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 34 of the Emergency Powers (Public Safety and Order) Regulations, 1955 to (No. 2) 1958, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Control of Motor Vehicles) Order, 1958.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Law or public instrument contained, from and after the 14th day of July, 1958, no motor vehicle shall be used on any road within the Colony unless the person driving such vehicle is in possession of a permit granted to him under the hand of the Chief Constable or a Commissioner or under the hand of any person authorised by the Chief Constable or by a Commissioner in that behalf, and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such permit.

3. Nothing in this Order contained shall apply to any—

(a) member of Her Majesty's Forces ;

(b) Police Officer ; or

(c) person holding a valid curfew pass issued pursuant to the Curfew Laws, 1955, 17 of 1955
47 of 1955

when such member of Her Majesty's Forces, such Police Officer or such person is acting in the course of his duty.

4. The Emergency Powers (Control of Public Service Motor Vehicles by Night) Order, 1958, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder. *Gazette :*
