In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 2 (1) of the Pensions Law, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of Executive Council, has been pleased to order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) (Amendment) Order, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) Order, 1957 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Pensionable Offices (Declaration) (Consolidation) Orders, 1957 to 1959.

2. In addition to the offices declared to be pensionable offices under the principal Order, the offices set out in the Schedule hereto are declared to be pensionable offices for the purposes of the Pensions Law.
