

[REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9899, December 31, 2009]

**AN ACT SEPARATING THE BASIAWAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL
TUBALAN ANNEX IN BARANGAY TUB ALAN, MUNICIPALITY OF
MALITA, PROVINCE OF DAVAO DEL SUR FROM THE BASIAWAN
NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, CONVERTING IT INTO AN
INDEPENDENT NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TO BE KNOWN AS
TUBALAN COMPREHENSIVE NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL AND
APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Separation and Conversion into a National High School.* - The Basiawan National High School - Tubalan Annex in Barangay Tubalan, Municipality of Malita, Province of Davao del Sur is hereby separated from the Basiawan National High School and converted into an independent national high school to be known as Tubalan Comprehensive National High School

SEC. 2. *Transfer of Assets and Liabilities.* - All personnel, assets, liabilities and records of the Basiawan National High School - Tubalan Annex are hereby transferred to and absorbed by the Tubalan Comprehensive National High School.

SEC. 3. *Appropriations.* - The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department's program the operationalization of the Tubalan Comprehensive National High School, the initial funding of which shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Basiawan National High School - Tubalan Annex. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the continued operation of the school shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 4. *Implementation.* - The Secretary of Education shall issue rules and regulations that may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.

SEC. 5. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette*.
