Safety Signs to All Right Hand Motor Vehicle

Imported right hand drive motor vehicles are currently being allowed to be registered to offset the shortage of transportation. However, numerous accidents reported have been traced to the inability of the driver to see clearly an on-coming vehicle or pedestrian on his blind side. This threat to public safety is alarming. To consider the safety factor involved in the operation of right hand drive vehicles, the following regulations are hereby promulgated in the operation of such vehicles:

SECTION 1. All right hand drive vehicles regardless of weight or classification are required to post the following signs:

1.1 MV with GVW of 4501 kgs. and Above —

- a. At the front windshield - "RHD VEHICLE — AN AIDE REQUIRED ON THE LEFTSIDE"
- b. At the rear - "CAUTION- RIGHT HAND DRIVE"
- c. Vehicles carrying a container van must have an independent sign to be attached or hooked to the container that reads: "CAUTION- RIGHT HAND DRIVE"
