EXECUTIVE PROGRAM OF THE CULTURAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA FOR 2002 TO 2004

The Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Government of the People's Republic of China, desiring to develop and strengthen further the cultural exchanges and friendly relations existing between the two countries on the basis of the Cultural Agreement signed in Beijing on July 8, 1979, have agreed, through mutual consultations, on the following Executive Program for Cultural Exchanges for 2002 to 2004, subject to the laws and regulations of each country.

ARTICLE I - CULTURAL AND ARTS EXCHANGES

1. Both sides will exchange visits of a five-member cultural delegation for a period of five days.

2. Both sides will exchange visits between the Cultural Policy Delegation of the Philippine Councilors League and Chinese Cultural Officials consisting of twenty members for a period of eight days within, the period of the program.

3. Both sides shall agree to collaborate on a musical theater production. Details shall be decided through consultations between the concerned agencies of the two sides.

4. Both sides will exchange visits of a group of eight to twelve students and teachers to attend ballet classes for seven to ten days.

5. Both sides will exchange visits of five writers for a period of ten days.

6. Both sides will exchange visits of two experts in the field of ancient art conservation and restoration for a period of ten days.

7. Both sides will send two faculty members from each other's educational institution for an exhibit of ethnic textiles and costumes, including digital photographs and reproductions, books and publications, and a lecture on traditional art.

8. Both sides will send a fifteen member chamber ensemble to perform in each other's country for ten days.

9. Both sides will exchange visits of a twelve-member stage play delegation to perform in each other's country for ten days.

ARTICLE II - EDUCATIONAL AND RESEARCH

10. Both sides will exchange teachers to teach language in the other's educational institutions on the basis of their necessity.
