We have been informed that imported used motor vehicles are being released from the Customs premises without the required certificates of Roadworthiness and compliance to emission standards issued from the country of origin duly authenticated by the Philippine Embassy/Consulate and/or by any agency authorized and accredited by the Philippine Government.

We wish to inform you that a **Certificate of Roadworthiness and Compliance to Emission Standards is required prior to the release of the imported used motor vehicles classified as regulated and liberalized commodities from the customs premises and the subsequent registration at the LTO**. This is in compliance with the provisions of Rule XXXII, Section 2, para. 3 of Republic Act (RA) No. 8749 otherwise known as the Philippine Clean Air Act of 199 and its implementing rules and regulations which states that a Certificate of
