

[MTC RESOLUTION NO. 4, S. 2000, May 12, 2000]

**AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION NO. 10,
SERIES OF 1999 ENTITLED "REVISED RULES AND REGULATIONS
IMPLEMENTING LOI NO. 1404 ESTABLISHING THE MARITIME
TRAINING COUNCIL"**

WHEREAS , MTC Resolution No. 10, Series of 1999 entitled "Revised Rules and Regulations Implementing LOI No. 1404 Establishing the Maritime Training Council" was approved on 9 November 1999;

WHEREAS, the said Resolution is one of the national instruments promulgated to give the 1978 STCW Convention, as amended, full and complete effect;

WHEREAS , the said Resolution is one of the principal documents communicated to the IMO Secretary-General in accordance with Regulation I/7 of the STCW, as amended;

WHEREAS , after the Consultative Meeting with the IMO Panel of Competent Persons in Tokyo, Japan on 26-27 April 2000 relative to the information submitted pursuant to Regulation I/7 of the Convention, as amended, it was noted that certain provisions of MTC Resolution No. 10, Series of 1999 need to be revised or amended to conform with the approved institutional framework under Executive Order No. 242;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of Section 2, paragraph 5 of LOI 1404, the Maritime Training Council hereby resolves, as it is hereby RESOLVED to amend the following provisions of MTC Resolution No. 10, Series of 1999:

1. Article II, Rule 5, numbers 4, 6 and 9 shall read as follows:
 4. *Administration* — refers to the Maritime Training Council which is the entity mandated to give effect to the Convention as provided for under Section 1 of LOI 1404;
 6. *Committee* — refers to the Executive Committee created by the Council pursuant to E.O. 242. Series of 2000;
 9. *Lead Agency* — refers to the agency that coordinates the activities of the different agencies implementing the requirements of the STCW Convention, as amended. It refers to the Maritime Industry Authority pursuant to E.O. 242, Series of 2000.
2. Article III, Rule 7, number 4 shall read as follows:
 4. Liaise, coordinate and communicate with the concerned government agencies/instrumentalities and private entities, and international organizations particularly the International
