**SUPPLEMENTING BOARD REGULATION NO. 5, SERIES OF 1972
BY INCLUDING ALPHA-METHYLTHIOFENTANYL, PARA-
FLUOROFENTANYL, BETA-HYDROXYFENTANYL, BETA-HYDROXY-
3-METHYLFENTANYL, THIOFENTANYL AND 3-
METHYLTHIOFENTANYL: THEIR SALTS, ISOMERS AND SALTS OF
ISOMERS; AND COMPOUNDS, MIXTURES, AND PREPARATIONS
CONTAINING SUCH SUBSTANCES IN THE LIST OF PROHIBITED
DRUGS SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS**

SECTION 1. Pursuant to its powers under Section 36(a) of Republic Act No. 6425, as amended, the Dangerous Drugs Board, having found later evaluation that the following substances:
