PROTOCOL OF THE SIXTH SESSION ON SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COOPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

Pursuant to the Agreement on Scientific and Technical Cooperation between the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Government of the People's Republic of China signed in Manila on March 14, 1978, the Philippine Delegation headed by Ramon B. Cardenas, Deputy Minister of Economic Planning and Deputy Director-General of the National Economic and Development Authority of the Republic of the Philippines, and the Chinese Delegation headed by Vice-Minister Wei Yuming of the Ministry of Foreign Economic Relations and Trade of the People's Republic of China, convened the Sixth Session on Philippine-Chinese Scientific and Technical Cooperation in Beijing from January 4 to January 10, 1984.

The lists of delegates of the Republic of the Philippines and the People's Republic of China appear as Annex I.

The two parties reviewed with satisfaction the implementation of the scientific and technical cooperation programme for the year 1983, and exchanged views on the further development and strengthening of scientific and technical cooperation between the two countries.

As a result of friendly consultations, the two parties reached the following agreements on matters concerning the scientific and technical cooperation programme for 1984:

The People's Republic of China agrees to the undertaking of the Philippine projects as outlined in Annex II to this Protocol;

The Republic of the Philippines agrees to the undertaking of the Chinese projects as outlined in Annex III to this Protocol;

The party which sends the study groups shall bear the travel expenses of such groups to and from the country of the receiving party. The receiving party shall bear the expenses for the food, accommodation, medical care and internal transport of such groups;

Seeds, seedlings, fish fries, specimens and similar materials for experiments, as well as technical information and data, shall be exchanged by the two parties free of charge and shall be delivered by the providing party to the Embassy of the receiving party with relevant transfer documents to be signed by the representatives of the two parties; and

Any additional projects and/or activities of scientific and technical cooperation which may be proposed by either party in the course of implementing this Protocol may, by mutual agreement through diplomatic channels, be implemented in the 1984 programme year and shall be included for record purposes in the Protocol of the next session.
