## CHAPTER 18.

### IMPERIAL STATUTES (LAW OF PROPERTY) ADOPTION.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Imperial Statutes (Law of Property) Adoption Ordinance. Short title.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 7 of the Interpretation Ordinance, and of sections 3 to 9 of this Ordinance, the Statutes of the Imperial Parliament set forth in the first column of the Schedule are hereby expressly declared to apply to this Colony to the extent specified in the second column of the Schedule. 3. So much of English Law as prohibits or restricts the alienation or devise of land for charitable purposes, or the bequest of personalty to be laid out in the purchase of land for charitable purposes, shall have no force or effect in the Colony. Charities.
