CHAPTER 70.

FREETOWN STREET TRADING.

An Ordinance to regulate trading in the streets of the Municipal City of Freetown.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Freetown Street Trading Ordinance, and shall apply to the City of Freetown.

2. For the purposes of this Ordinance—

“goods” means anything which is the subject of trade, manufacture or merchandise (including animals);

“street” includes any road, square, court, alley, lane, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not, over which the public have a right of way, together with the land, whether covered or not by any pavement, verandah, or other structure which lies between the roadway and the boundary of any land adjoining thereto over which the public have no right of way, as well as all public open places and such waste land adjoining any street or road as may have been reserved for its protection or benefit;

“City” means the City of Freetown, as defined by the Freetown Municipality Ordinance.

3. (1) The Governor in Council after consultation with the City Council of Freetown may from time to time by a notice published in the *Gazette* prohibit the sale or exposure for sale, of all goods, subject to such exceptions as may be declared in such notice, in the streets, or in or upon any specified street or part
