SINGAPORE ARMED FORCES GOOD SERVICE MEDAL

RULES 1975

It is hereby notified for general information that the President, having been pleased to approve the institution of a medal to be styled “The Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal”, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal Rules, 1975, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1975.

2. In these Rules, the expression “qualifying service” means all the time an officer or soldier has served —

- (a) in full-time service in the Singapore Armed Forces whether Regular, Mobilised or National Service;
- (b) in voluntary service in the division of the Singapore Armed Forces known as the People’s Defence Force; and
- (c) as a reservist in the Singapore Armed Forces.

3.—(1) A medal to be known as the Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal (hereinafter in these Rules referred to as “the Medal”) may be awarded to a serving member of the Singapore Armed Forces in recognition of his good, efficient and faithful service in the Singapore Armed Forces.

(2) The minimum period qualifying for the award of the Medal shall be as follows:—

- (a) in the case of full-time servicemen, five years full-time continuous qualifying service;
- (b) in the case of reservists, two years full-time continuous qualifying service, and attendance at three Annual In-Camp Trainings;
- (c) in the case of volunteers, six years part-time continuous service.

4. The following provisions shall apply in computing the period qualifying for the award of the Medal:—

- (a) that there has been no break in service;
- (b) where there has been a change from one form of service to another, such service shall be considered as continuous service;
- (c) a day’s break in service imposed between one form of service and another for the purposes of awarding a pension or gratuity under the Singapore Armed Forces Pensions Scheme Regulations, 1971 (G.N. No. S 104/71) shall not be deemed to be a break in service; and
