SINGAPORE ARMED FORCES GOOD SERVICE MEDAL

RULES 1975

It is hereby notified for general information that the President, having been pleased to approve the institution of a medal to be styled "The Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal", hereby makes the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal Rules ,1975, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1975.
- **2.** In these Rules, the expression "qualifying service" means all the time an officer or soldier has served
 - (a) in full-time service in the Singapore Armed Forces whether Regular, Mobilised or National Service;
 - (b) in voluntary service in the division of the Singapore Armed Forces known as the People's Defence Force; and
 - (c) as a reservist in the Singapore Armed Forces.
- **3.**—(1) A medal to be known as the Singapore Armed Forces Good Service Medal (hereinafter in these Rules referred to as "the Medal") may be awarded to a serving member of the Singapore Armed Forces in recognition of his good, efficient and faithful service in the Singapore Armed Forces.
 - (2) The minimum period qualifying for the award of the Medal shall be as follows:—
 - (a) in the case of full-time servicemen, five years full-time continuous qualifying service;
 - (b) in the case of reservists, two years full-time continuous qualifying service, and attendance at three Annual In-Camp Trainings;
 - (c) in the case of volunteers, six years part-time continuous service.
- **4.** The following provisions shall apply in computing the period qualifying for the award of the Medal:—
 - (a) that there has been no break in service;
 - (b) where there has been a change from one form of service to another, such service shall be considered as continuous service;
 - (c) a day's break in service imposed between one form of service and another for the purposes of awarding a pension or gratuity under the Singapore Armed Forces Pensions Scheme Regulations, 1971 (G.N. No. S 104/71) shall not be deemed to be a break in service; and
