In exercise of the powers conferred by section 142 of the Road Traffic Act, the Minister for Transport makes the following Order:

Citation

1. This Order is the Road Traffic (Car-Free Sunday SG — Exemption for Personal Mobility Device Riders) (No. 4) Order 2018.

Definitions

2. In this Order —

“Car-Free Sunday SG” means the event known as Car-Free Sunday SG conducted on the roads specified in the Schedule on 29 July 2018 from 5 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.;

“non-compliant personal mobility device” has the meaning given by section 2(1) of the Active Mobility Act 2017 (Act 3 of 2017).

Exemption for personal mobility device riders

3. Sections 5A and 5B of the Act do not apply to an individual who rides on 29 July 2018 a personal mobility device on any road or part of any road specified in the Schedule, in connection with Car-Free Sunday SG, if all of the following conditions are satisfied:

- (a) the personal mobility device is not ridden at a speed exceeding 15 km/h;
- (b) the personal mobility device is not a non-compliant personal mobility device;
- (c) during the time from 5 a.m. to 7 a.m., the individual must wear or the personal mobility device must display —
 - (i) a white light that is clearly visible for a reasonable distance from the front of the individual or personal mobility device, as the case may be; and
 - (ii) a red light that is clearly visible for a reasonable distance from the back of the individual or personal mobility device, as the case may be;
- (d) if owing to the presence of the personal mobility device on a road an accident occurs whereby another individual is injured or any property (including any animal) is damaged or destroyed, the individual who rides the personal mobility device (called the rider) complies as far as the circumstances permit with the following requirements:
 - (i) must immediately stop the personal mobility device;
 - (ii) must immediately render such assistance as the rider can;
 - (iii) must at the scene of the accident as soon as possible give the rider's name and residential address, and also the name and address of the owner of the personal mobility device —
 - (A) to the individual who has been injured or to the owner of any property that has been damaged or destroyed; or
