PART I

PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police Regulations.

PART II

ORGANISATION AND DISTRIBUTION

Ranks

2. The ranks of the Police Force in descending order of seniority shall be as follows:

(a) *Senior Police Officers:*

- (i) Commissioner
- (ii) Deputy Commissioner
- (iii) Senior Assistant Commissioner
- (iv) Assistant Commissioner
- (v) Deputy Assistant Commissioner
- (vi) Superintendent
- (vii) Deputy Superintendent
- (viii) Assistant Superintendent
- (ix) Probationary Assistant Superintendent
- (x) Inspector
- (xi) Probationary Inspector
- (xii) Cadet Inspector.

(b) *Ranks below the rank of inspector:*

- (i) Senior Station Inspector (2)
- (ii) Senior Station Inspector
- (iii) Station Inspector
- (iv) Senior Staff Sergeant
- (v) Staff Sergeant
- (vi) Sergeant
- (vii) Corporal
- (viii) Constable.

PART III

DISCIPLINE AND PUNISHMENT

Complaints against police officers

- 3.—(1) Every complaint against a police officer shall —
- (a) be made in writing;
 - (b) be read over to the person making the complaint; and
 - (c) be signed by the person making the complaint.
- (2) Upon receipt of such complaint, the complaint shall be investigated immediately.

Disciplinary offence disclosed against officer below rank of inspector

- 4.—(1) If, as a result of an investigation, a disciplinary offence is disclosed against a police officer below the rank of inspector, he shall be charged.
- (2) Every charge shall describe the offence in the terms of the act in such manner as to identify the act or omission complained of.

Disciplinary proceedings against officer below rank of inspector

- 5.—(1) When a police officer below the rank of inspector has been charged, disciplinary proceedings shall be conducted by a disciplinary officer authorised in that behalf without undue delay.
- (2) Every charge shall be read and explained to the officer concerned and he shall be asked if he pleads guilty or claims to be tried.
- (3) If there are 2 or more charges, the officer concerned shall be called upon to plead separately to each charge, and his reply shall be clearly and separately recorded in respect of each charge.
- (4) A charge may be amended or altered at any time before the finding.
- (5) Every alteration made to the charge shall be read and explained to the officer concerned and he shall be called upon to plead anew to the altered charge and to justify any demand he may make for additional time to prepare his defence.
- (6) If the officer concerned pleads guilty, the disciplinary officer conducting the disciplinary proceedings may accept the plea and record a conviction against him and impose on such officer such punishment as the disciplinary officer is empowered by the Act to impose, except that where the disciplinary officer conducting the disciplinary proceedings considers that the officer should be dismissed or retired from the Police Force, the disciplinary officer shall forward the record of the proceedings with his
