COURT OF APPEAL ACT

AN ACT TO REGULATE APPEALS TO THE COURT OF APPEAL.1

Commencement [1st July, 1990]²

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Court of Appeal Act.

2 Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —

"appeal" includes a case stated;

"appellant" includes a person who has been convicted and desires to appeal under this Act;

"Registrar" means the Registrar of the Court of Appeal;

"sentence" includes any order of the Court made on conviction with reference to the person convicted.
