**The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Scotland)
Declaratory (No. 3) Order 2001**

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by article 17(1) of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order 1983⁽¹⁾, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:

Citation, commencement and extent

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Scotland) Declaratory (No. 3) Order 2001 and shall come into force on 14th April 2001 at 2.00 p.m.

(2) This Order extends to Scotland only.

Declaration of infected area

2. The area described in Schedule 1 to this Order is declared an infected area within the meaning of and to which the provisions of Part III of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order 1983 apply as varied in accordance with, and disappplied to the extent set out in, Schedule 2 to this Order.

Enforcement

3. The provisions of Part III of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order 1983 shall, insofar as they are to be enforced in slaughterhouses, be enforced by the Scottish Ministers.
