The Police Grant (Scotland) Order 2001

The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 32(3) and (5) of the Police (Scotland) Act 1967(1) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Police Grant (Scotland) Order 2001 and shall come into force on 1st April 2001.

(2) In this Order—

“the Act” means the Police (Scotland) Act 1967;

“authority” means a police authority (not being a constituent authority) or a joint police board;

“financial year 2001-2002” means the period of 12 months commencing on 1st April 2001; and

“police grant” means the grant made under section 32(1) of the Act.

Aggregate amount of grants for financial year 2001-2002

2. The aggregate amount of police grant to be made for the financial year 2001-2002 shall be £409,485,000.

Amount of grant to an authority for financial year 2001-2002

3. The amount of police grant to be made for the financial year 2001-2002 to each authority specified in column 1 of the Table below shall be the amount determined in relation to that authority which is set out in column 2 of that Table opposite to the name of that authority—
