# CRIMINAL LAW, ENGLAND AND WALES

The Policing and Crime Act 2017 (Possession of Pyrotechnic Articles at Musical Events) Regulations 2017

Made - - - - 8th March 2017

Laid before Parliament 9th March 2017

Coming into force - 3rd April 2017

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the power conferred by section 134(5) of the Policing and Crime Act 2017(1).

### Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Policing and Crime Act 2017 (Possession of Pyrotechnic Articles at Musical Events) Regulations 2017 and come into force on 3rd April 2017.
  - (2) In these Regulations—

"premises licence" has the meaning given in section 11 of the Licensing Act 2003(2);

"the provision of regulated entertainment" has the meaning given in Schedule 1(3) to the Licensing Act 2003.

### **Specified description of event**

- **2.**—(1) For the purposes of section 134(5) of the Policing and Crime Act 2017, an event to which paragraph (2) applies is specified.
  - (2) This paragraph applies to an event that—
    - (a) is provided to any extent for members of the public or a section of the public; and
    - (b) takes place on premises in respect of which—
      - (i) a premises licence has been granted; and
      - (ii) the licence authorises the premises to be used for the provision of regulated entertainment in the form of a performance of live music.
