The Scottish Ministers, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 21 of the Clean Air Act 1993⁽¹⁾ and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, being satisfied that the classes of fireplace which are exempt by this Order can be used for burning fuel other than authorised fuels without producing any smoke or a substantial quantity of smoke, hereby make the following Order—

Citation, commencement and extent

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Smoke Control Areas (Exempt Fireplaces) (Scotland) Order 2001 and shall come into force on 16th February 2001.

(2) This Order extends to Scotland only.

Classes of fireplace exempt from section 20 of the Clean Air Act 1993

2. The classes of fireplace described in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are hereby exempt, upon the conditions specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of that Schedule, from the provisions of section 20 of the Clean Air Act 1993 (which prohibits smoke emissions in smoke control areas).
