
THE PRINCIPAL PROBATE REGISTRY (NON-CONTENTIOUS
BUSINESS) ORDER, 1946. DATED MARCH 5, 1946.

1946 No. 320 (L. 4)

I, William Allen Baron Jowitt, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Administration of Justice (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf and with the concurrence of two other Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby order as follows:—

1. On and after the 30th day of March, 1946, the Probate Registry at Llandudno shall be closed and the non-contentious probate business of that Registry shall be transacted in the Principal Probate Registry in London: Closing of
Probate
Registry at
Llandudno.

Provided that the Principal Probate Registry in London shall not be open for the transaction of the said business until the 10th day of April, 1946.

2. On and after the 10th day of April, 1946—

(a) there shall be transacted in the Department of the Principal Probate Registry in London dealing with the application for grants of probate and letters of administration without the intervention of a solicitor all classes of business which were transacted therein immediately before the 17th day of September, 1940, and Restoration
