ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Roads (Speed Limit) (No.2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1988

Made 7th September 1988

Coming into operation 24th October 1988

*To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 3(3) of
Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974*

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 50(4) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Roads (Speed Limit) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1988 and shall come into operation on 24th October 1988.

Increase of speed limit

2. In relation to the roads and lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 the rate of speed fixed by Article 50(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 shall be increased to forty miles per hour.

3. In relation to the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 the rate of speed fixed by Article 50(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 shall be increased to fifty miles per hour.

Revocations

4. The provisions described in Schedule 3 are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE 1

Roads or Lengths of Road on which the Speed Limit is increased to 40 mph.

1. Longshot Road, Ballyrobert, Route B59, from its junction with Ballyclare Road, to a point approximately 120 metres north-west of that junction.
2. Prince Charles Way, Newtownabbey, from a point approximately 50 metres north-west of Ashgrove Roundabout, to a point approximately 50 metres south-east of Manse Road.
3. Comber Road, Route A21, Newtownards, from a point approximately 457 metres south of the Court Street/South Street junction, to a point approximately 2,031 metres south of that junction.
4. Flying Horse Road, Unclassified No. 251, Downpatrick, from its junction with the Downpatrick/Killough Road, Route B176, to a point approximately 990 metres from that junction.
5. Crawfordsburn Road, Route B20, Bangor, from a point approximately 383 metres north-east of its junction with Cootehall Road, Crawfordsburn, to a point approximately 1,019 metres north-east of that junction.
6. Newtownards Road, Bangor, Route A21, from a point approximately 134 metres south of its junction with the South and West Circular Roads, to a point approximately 1,430 metres south of that junction.
7. Culmore Road, Route A2, Londonderry, from its junction with Madams Bank Road, to a point approximately 200 metres north-east of its junction with Colby Avenue.
8. Glengalliagh Road, Londonderry, from its junction with Templemore Road, to its junction with Madams Bank Road.
9. Madams Bank Road, Route A515, Londonderry, from its junction with Culmore Road, to its junction with Glengalliagh Road.
10. Dublin Road (Route A1, (T4)), Newry, from a point approximately 178 metres north-west of its junction with Forkhill Road, Route B113, to a point approximately 828 metres south-west of that junction.
11. Annesborough Road, Unclassified No. 1125, Lurgan.
12. Annesborough Road, Unclassified No. 1048, from its junction with Annesborough Road, Unclassified No. 1125, for a distance of approximately 178 metres.
13. Cottage Road, Unclassified No. 1124, Dollingstown, from its junction with Belfast Road, Route A3, to its junction with Kilmore Road.
14. Point Road, Lawrencetown, Unclassified No. 4149, from its junction with Banbridge Road, Route A50, for a distance of approximately 400 metres south-east of that junction.
