Lough Erne—Close Seasons

BYE-LAW, DATED 12TH AUGUST, 1964, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE FISHERIES ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1842 TO 1954.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of its powers under Sections 33 and 91 of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act 1842(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Bye-Law:—

1. In that part of Lower Lough Erne in the County of Fermanagh lying between Rosscor Viaduct and an imaginary line running directly from North to South and passing through the Eastern tip of the island known as Ferny Island in the Parish of Belleek, Barony of Lurg and County of Fermanagh, the close season for fishing with rod and line for salmon and trout shall henceforth commence on the 11th October in each year and end on the last day of February in the year following.

2. This Bye-Law may be cited as the Lough Erne (Alteration of Close Season) Bye-Law (Northern Ireland) 1964.
