

PART I: PURPOSES AND CONTEXT

Introduction

Republic

- 1. The main programme document for the 1990 World Census of Agriculture (hereafter called the World Programme or WP, for short) has been prepared for use in all countries of the world. However, particular considerations may apply within different regional groupings of countries across the world. The purpose of this European Supplement to the World Programme is to set out the considerations which are likely to apply to countries within the European region, broadly defined. Many of these countries have relatively well developed systems of agricultural statistics.
- For this purpose the European Region is defined as comprising the following countries:
