
Global Wage Report

Global Employment Trends



Advances in Labour Studies

Advances in Labour Studies is a wide-ranging series of research titles co-published by the ILO and Palgrave Macmillan, offering in-depth analysis of labour issues from a global perspective. The series has an interdisciplinary flavour that reflects the unique nature of labour studies, where economics, law, social policy and labour relations combine.

Regulating for Decent Work is an international, interdisciplinary response to the neoliberal ideologies that have shaped labour market regulation in recent decades. The book advances the academic and policy debates on post-crisis labour regulation by identifying new challenges, subjects and theoretical perspectives. In contrast to the dominant deregulatory approaches, it calls for labour market regulation to be reinvigorated.






International Journal of Labour Research

Checkpoints Series






