Introduction

This publication presents the results of the International Conference on “Standards and Regulatory Systems”, held in Geneva on 19 November 2013 and organized by UNECE in cooperation with the Russian Union of Industrialists and Entrepreneurs.

It is organized as follows. Section 1 provides the text of Recommendation D on, “Reference to Standards” that was adopted by the Working Party on Regulatory Cooperation and Standardization Policies as the result of the Conference. Section 2 provides background on the historical context and policy issues related to the use of standards in regulatory work. Finally, Section 3 provides a summary of the deliberations made at the Conference.

Standards are a versatile tool. Increasingly, authorities all over the world use standards to attain diverse policy goals such as preserving communities and fragile eco-systems from the effects of natural and man-made disasters, ensuring that consumers are protected from hazards and from fraud, providing and maintaining safe and energy-efficient transport networks. The list is endless.

Legislators and authorities have long acknowledged that making use of standards is often more cost efficient and expedient than classical legislative tools. In fact, to regulate economic and productive activities *without* making use of standards is now the exception, rather than the rule and, in a number of fields, it is simply unimaginable.

The question is no longer whether to use standards in regulations. The question is now: “how” can we best use standards? This is the question that was
