Much has happened in the 2 short years since we issued our first such report. The Asia and Pacific region has continued its rapid economic growth. However, rising costs from environmental degradation and the region's contributions to climate change are increasingly recognized. Moreover, publication of this report comes at a time when the region is facing severe impacts from a global economic downturn.
