



Asian Highway Network



- Connecting 32 countries
- Intergovernmental Agreement on the AH Network sets naming, classification and design standards
- Vital connectivity especially for landlocked countries





Trans Asian Railway



- 117500km of railway lines of international importance connecting 27 countries
- Important transport corridors with huge economic potential for transiting countries (both landlocked and coastal countries)
- Faster than maritime transport (Asia-Europe)
- Lower environment impact
- Dry ports promote multimodality






Landlocked countries is also Land-linked countries
