Concept Note

Expert Group Meeting on Digital Connectivity for Sustainable Development, United Nations Conference Centre (UNCC), Bangkok, Thailand, 3-4 October 2016.

Background:

It is well-recognized that Information Communications Technology (ICT) is a key enabler for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the goals of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS). Furthermore, as a meta-infrastructure ICT supports a wide range of other infrastructures and activities across the whole spectrum of human endeavours that promote sustainable development. Notwithstanding the efforts that each country and sub-region is making towards enhanced ICT connectivity, the broadband penetration in several Asia and the Pacific economies are still very low with widening gaps between countries. The digital divide within the Asia-Pacific region is in large part driven by missing physical infrastructure, inefficient internet traffic management, the cost of broadband and limited e-resilience.

In response, through ESCAP Resolution 71/10, ESCAP requested the Secretariat to establish an openended working group on the Asia-Pacific Information Superhighway (AP-IS)¹. In addition, the Secretariat was requested to conduct regional ICT analyses, including to update its fibre-optic terrestrial and submarine cable maps (in collaboration with ITU), and to collaborate with other relevant national and regional institutions. The first Working Group meeting² was held in Incheon, Republic of Korea in September 2015. As per the recommendations from the meeting, a Steering Group was established to develop an AP-IS Master Plan detailing the principles, deliverables, timeline and financing mechanisms with a regional cooperation framework document. The second Working Group meeting was held in Guangzhou, China PR on 29-30 August 2016. The members of the Working Group reviewed the draft Master Plan and Regional Cooperation Framework³ on the AP-IS and recommended that it be presented to the first meeting of the Committee on Information and Communications Technology, Science, Technology and Innovations (CICTSTI) on 5-7 October 2016.

Objectives:

Against this background, the objectives of this Expert Group Meeting are to:

- a) Review state of ICT in Asia and the Pacific, discuss challenges and policy options;
- b) Discuss the regional review on implementation of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) action lines for the achievement of SDGs;
- c) Inform experts of the updates on the AP-IS draft Master Plan and Regional Cooperation Framework Document adopted at the second Working Group meeting held in China in August 2016.
