UNNExT Workshop on Implementing UN/CEFACT eBusiness Standards in Agricultural Trade 21 December 2015, Bangkok, Thailand

Background:

This workshop is designed to introduce participants to eBusiness standards in agricultural trade. The workshop will also present and discuss the forthcoming UNNExT Handbook on Implementing UN/CEFACT eBusiness Standards in Agricultural Trade. Cross-border trade of agricultural produce is complex and export competitiveness requires close collaboration of public and private stakeholders. Innovative agriculture supply chains, paperless trade and new approaches to improve supply chain management have been developed and implemented during the past years in particular in the developed economies. These concepts also provide new opportunities for agriculture trade of developing countries. The adoption of the latest electronic Business messages and standards for agricultural trade can help to address the inefficiencies in agricultural supply chains. UN/CEFACT develops international standards and best practice for simplified trade and the efficient application of government regulations. The standards are highly integrated, this allowing an end-to-end management of the supply chain and the collaboration of public and private sector stakeholders. For example, UN/CEFACT recently developed eLab, a set of messages to simplify laboratory testing procedures in import and export.

The lack of knowledge on the application of eBusiness standards in many developing countries leads to a very slow adaptation resulting to loss of competitiveness and compliance issues. This workshop and the forthcoming Handbook will introduce policy makers and technical cooperating agencies on the use of business technology as a tool to support reform and address bottlenecks in the agricultural supply chain. The purpose of the Handbook and the workshop is to bridge this gap and speed up the adoption relevant eBusiness standards for agriculture trade.

This workshop is organized by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) and the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe. It is implemented with the support of the United Nations Network of Experts for Paperless Trade and Transport in Asia and the Pacific (UNNExT), a community of knowledge dedicated to building governments' capacity to implement paperless systems for trade facilitation and sustainable development.
