What?

- Study on digital connectivity and the potential for transitioning towards a digital economy in 10 countries: Azerbaijan, Afghanistan, Armenia, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan

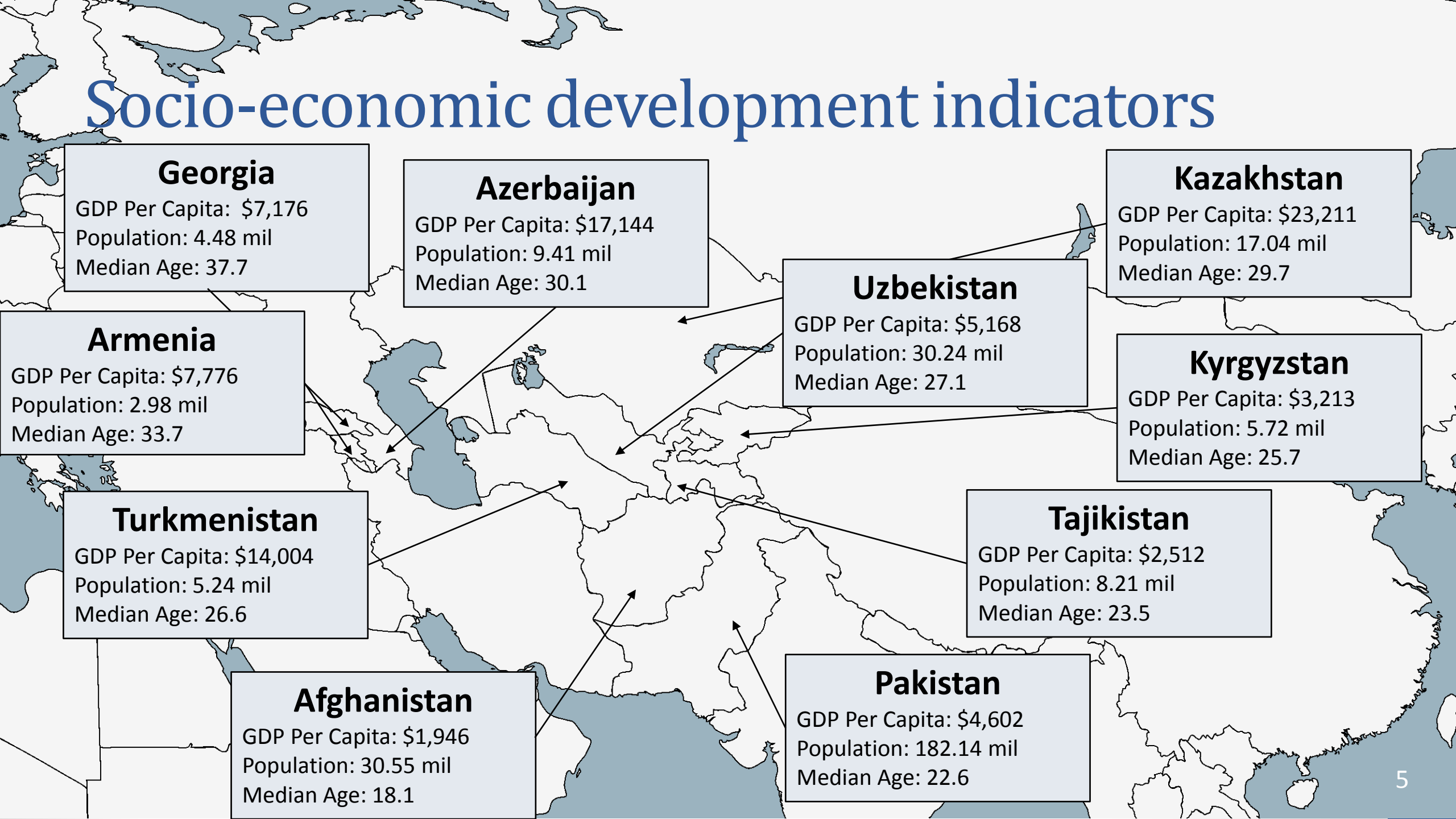
Why?

- To identify main pain points throttling the Internet connectivity in the target countries and to propose policy options for creating an enabling Internet ecosystem in the region

How?

- Using secondary research on infrastructure development, Internet access, usage and the policy environment, including an analysis of the barriers and constraints, and including a set of policy recommendations

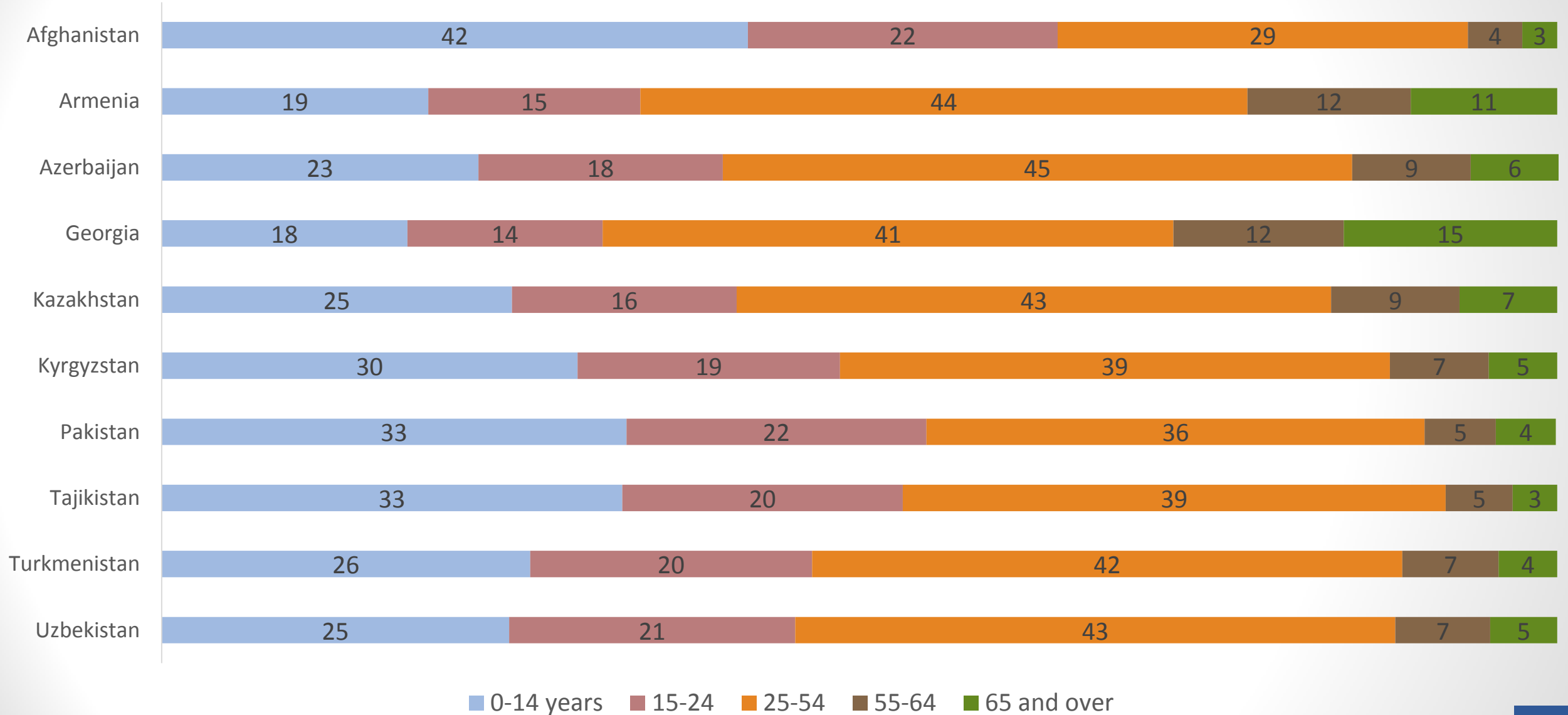

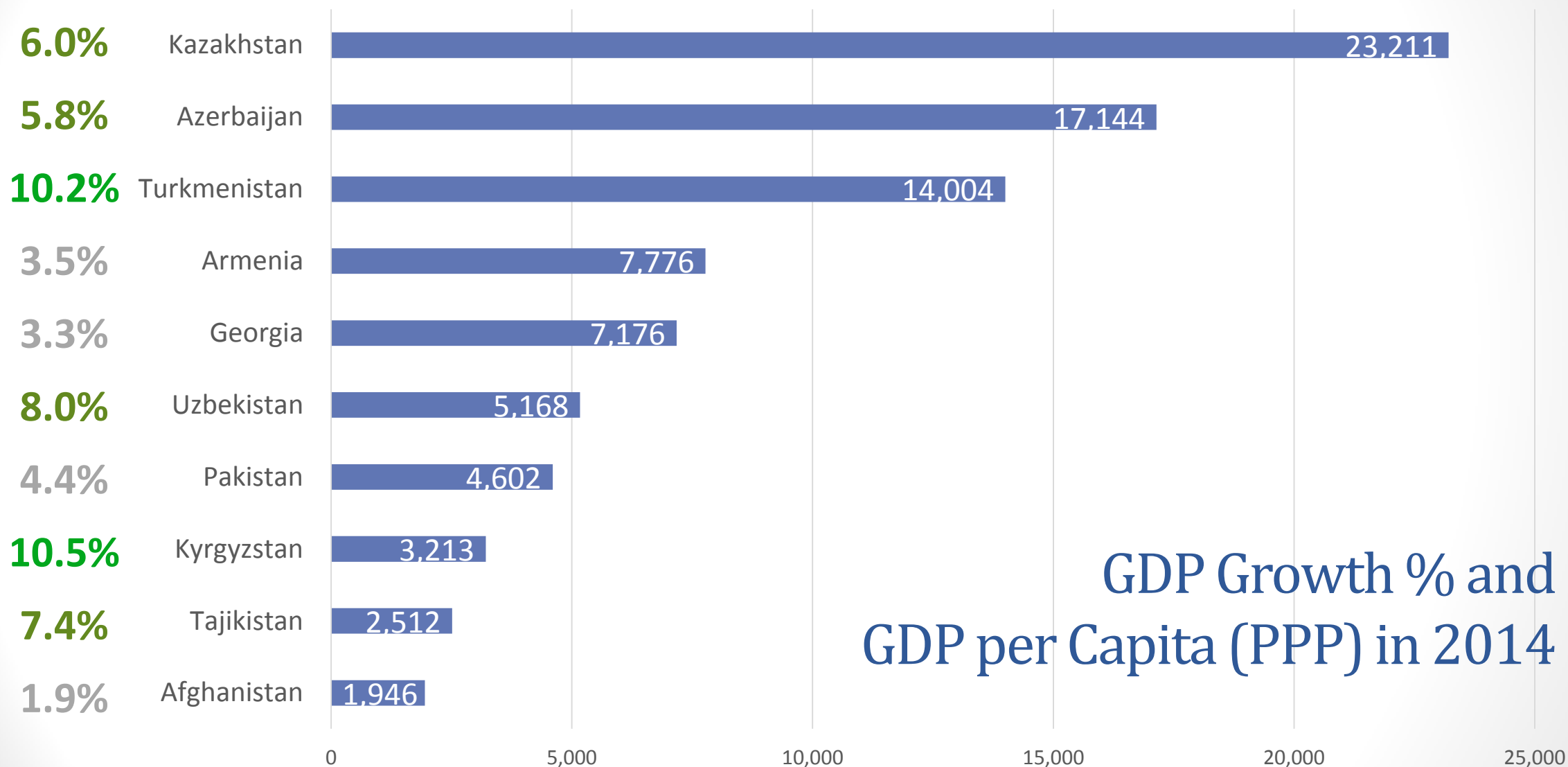
