Barriers to Internet Availability and Adoption

Supply-side (availability)

- Why are costs too high?
- Investment roadblocks:
 - ❖ Regulations
 - ❖ Rights-of-way access
 - ❖ Taxation

Demand-side (adoption)

- Why is interest too low?
- Locally relevant content:
 - ❖ Language
 - ❖ Location
 - ❖ Support
