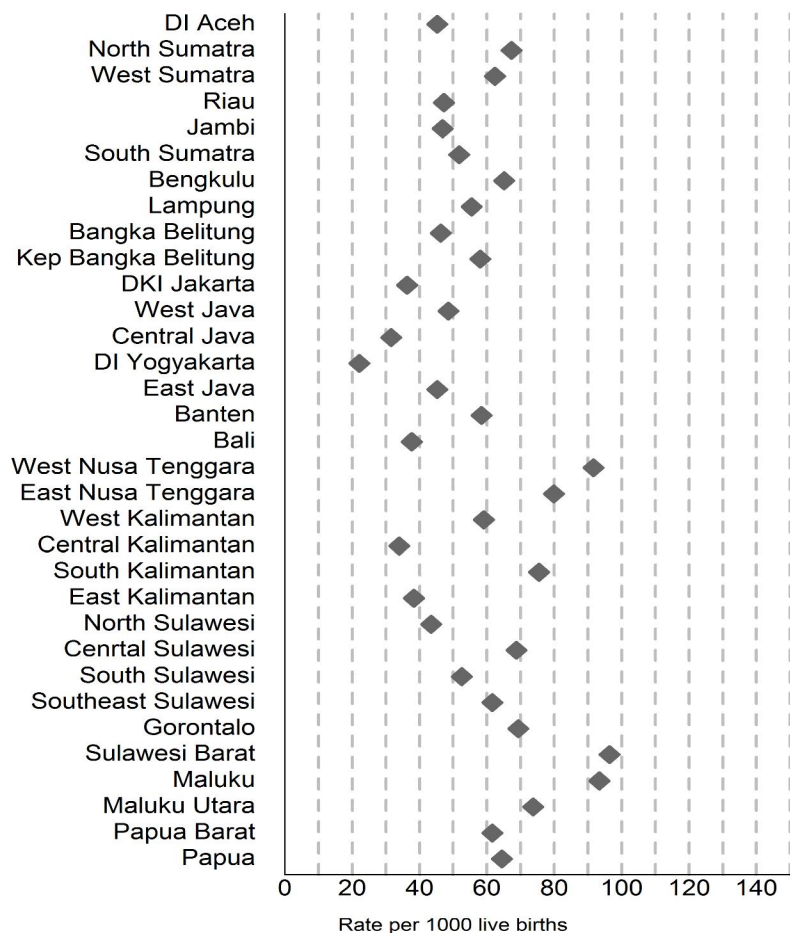

MDG disparities within countries in health

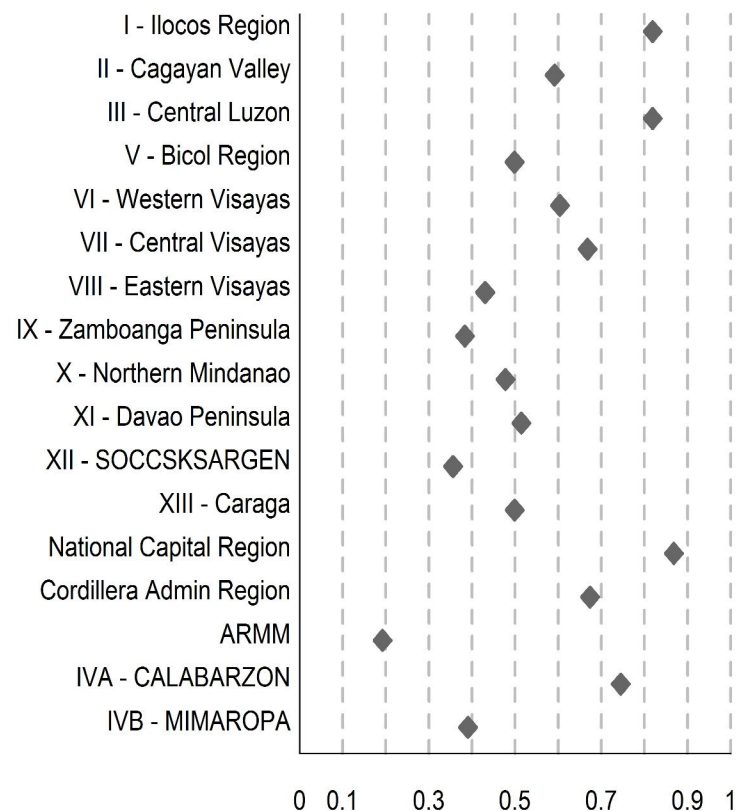
- in countries, some provinces or districts lag behind
- differences are large on those between high-performing and low-performing countries
- access to services
- case: Indonesia, Philippines and Nepal

Under-5 Mortality, Indonesia 2007

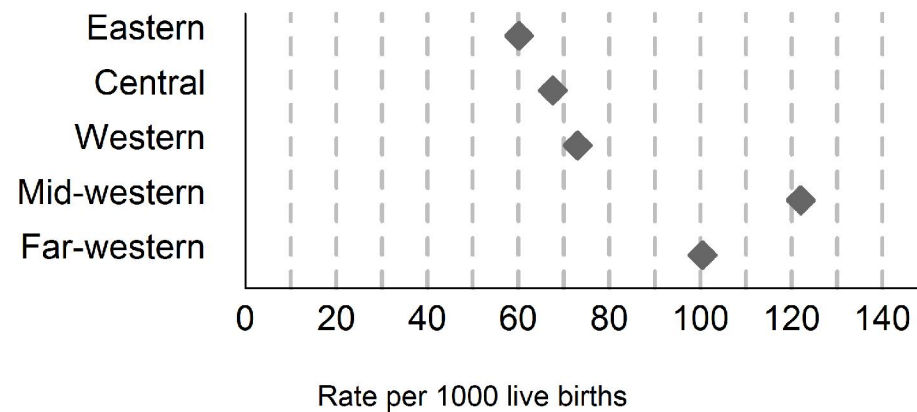


Skilled birth attendance Philippines 2008

- child mortalities
- child malnutrition
- maternity care

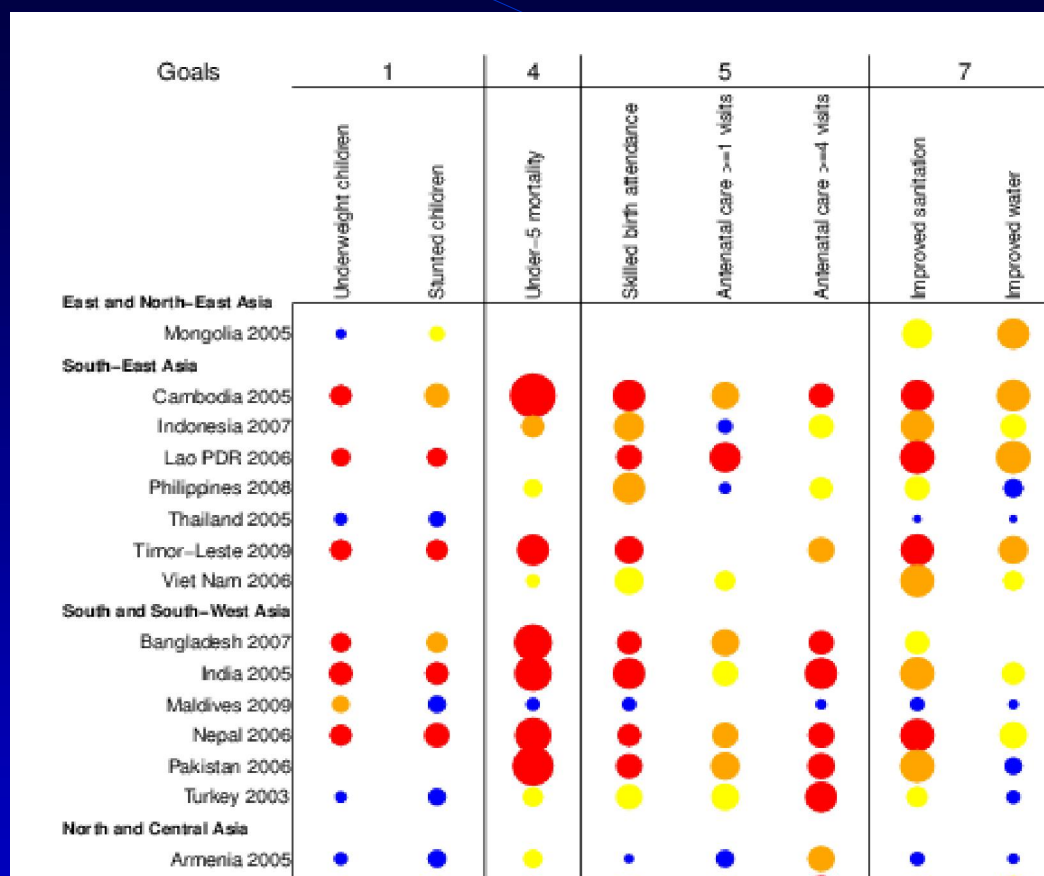
- disparities reflect in:

- income
- education
- employment status

Analysis of 8 indicators

- under-five children underweight and stunted (MDG 1)
- under-five mortality (MDG 4)
- skilled birth attendance and antenatal care (MDG 5)
- access to improved water and sanitation (MDG 7)
