And to create such societies with the participation of people from all generations and from a wide range of stakeholders.


Population ageing is one of the priority areas of social development for the six member countries in the East and North-East Asian (ENEAA) subregion. In 2010, the number of older persons in ENEAA countries accounted for 60% of the 65+ population in Asia, and 32% of the 65+ population in the world.

The goal of the Knowledge-Sharing Platform is to provide *an online database of innovations and knowledge on population ageing* that can serve the interests of all persons trying to build vibrant ageing societies.


The website is available in English, as well as the 5 subregional languages (Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Mongolian and Russian).

Population Ageing in East and North-East Asia (ENEA)

- Proportion of older persons (aged 65+) within the total population



- Older persons (aged 65+) in ENEA account for nearly one-third of the older persons in the world, as of 2010.






2) **Country Profiles:** Overview of population ageing in the six countries of East and North-East Asia
