Agreement on Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures (SPS)

This session will present the key provision of the WTO's SPS Agreement including risk assessment, harmonization, transparency, equivalence and regionalization. 09.30 – 11.00 Session 4: Trade remedies: subsidies, safeguards and antidumping

WTO Agreement on Subsidies and Countervailing Measures (ASCM)

Speaker: Mr. Rajesh Aggarwal

This session will introduce participants to the WTO Agreement on subsidies and countervailing measures (SCM). The discussion will include the commitments and obligations expected of countries acceding to the WTO and examine subsidies or domestic support as internal policies affecting foreign trade in goods.

The first session will outline how subsidies are defined in the Agreement and look at their categories to prohibitive, actionable and agricultural subsidies. The Session will set out examples of how acceded countries have phased out their domestic support and subsidies.

The second session on subsidies and countervailing measures will give special focus to the more favorable terms afforded LDCs with respect to subsidies disciplines. Discussion will include flexibilities provided by the SCM to give policy space to LDCs in pursuing their industrial developments. The session will also briefly look at cases where measures counteracting the effect of subsidies (determined by the agreement) may be applied. These cases include the existence of subsidized imports, injury to a domestic industry, and a direct link between the subsidized imports and the injury.

WTO Agreement on Anti-dumping

The session will concentrate on the WTO agreement on anti-dumping Agreement. The discussion will focus on how the implementation of Article VI of GATT 1994, otherwise known as the anti-dumping agreement, authorizes the use of a specific anti-dumping duty on imports from a particular source in cases where dumping threatens injury to a domestic industry. The session will look at the implementation of anti-dumping commitments by recently acceded members.
